## WASTE MANAGEMENT BYLAW 46-2018

### 5.2 GARBAGE COLLECTION

No person shall place Garbage out for collection unless it is contained in a Garbage Bag described as follows:
a) An Acceptable Garbage bag must be at a minimum, $60 \mathrm{~cm} \times 90 \mathrm{~cm}$ ( $24 \mathrm{in} \times 36 \mathrm{in}$ ) and a maximum of $106 \mathrm{~cm} \times 120 \mathrm{~cm}$ (42 in x 48 in ) not weighing over 50 pounds per bag and securely tied. Garbage Bags may be placed in a receptacle but must not be loosein the container.

b) Any receptacle placed out for collection that is broken or that breaks when lifted will not be collected.

## What Goes in:



## Glass

- Bottles and jars


## Metal

- Metal cans, soft drink cans, jar lids (steel and aluminum)
- Aluminum trays and foil (clean)
- Empty aerosol cans
- Empty paint cans with lids separated


## Plastics

- All household plastic containers; \#1-\#5, \#7
- Plastic bottles, jugs, tubs, lids
- Rigid packaging and containers from food, beverage and household products
(i.e. shampoo, yogurt, margarine, ice cream, clear shells, trays and BBQ chicken containers)


## Paper

- Paper cups (including fast food drink cups)
- Polycoat container (i.e. milk and juice cartons gable top, Tetra Pak and frozen juice containers)
- Fine paper, bills, flyers, envelopes, newsprint magazine, boxboard
- Paperback books, egg cartons, kraft paper, phone books, brochures


## What Stays Out: $X$

- Dishes, porcelain and ceramics
- Window panes, light bulbs, mirrors


## Metal

- Laminated foil, takeout food lids
- Candy and cigarette wrapping, chip bags
- Scrap metal, small appliances
- Full and partially full aerosols should be treated as hazardous waste


## Plastics

- Plastic bags, cellophane film
- Styrofoam cups, trays or packaging,
 laminated packaging
- Toys, hoses, durable plastic products
- Seed trays, plant and garden packaging (please return to local nursery)


## Paper

- Tissue, paper towels, napkins, waxed paper
- Laminated, metallic paper
- Contaminated paper (i.e. soiled pizza boxes)
- Hard covers on books


## WASTE MANAGEMENT BYLAW 46-2018 5.3 RECYCLING COLLECTION

No person shall place Recyclable Materials out for collection unless they are contained in one of the following approved receptacles:
a) Blue or black plastic boxes with a lip for handling, that is clearly and easily identifiable to contain Recyclable Materials without spilling and that do not exceed 130 litres ( 35 gallons) and shall be specifically manufactured for the purpose of recycling collection;
b) Clear or blue plastic bags not exceeding 22 kilograms ( 50 lbs .); or
c) Recyclable Fibres and other waste paper tied securely in Bundles not larger than 1 metre by 1 metre by 0.5 metres ( 3 feet by 3 feet by 12 inches) and not exceeding 22 kilograms ( 50 lbs .) in weight.
